Ex Libris' Alma and Primo VE training is all delivered online. You may start to work through it now. These are good places to start:

Getting to Know Alma ("GTKA")

The Getting to Know Alma webinar series is designed to help you understand the functional areas of Alma, learn basic Alma vocabulary, and become familiar with day-to-day workflows in Alma before you begin implementation. There are 4 GTKA webinars that you can attend live, or watch as recordings. They sometimes reference access to the test environment that Ex Libris calls the "Sandbox". At this time, only the Vanguard libraries have Sandbox access. We anticipate extending this access to all I-Share libraries in late summer 2019.
